Taking groceries off the shelves

This summer, CFR began taking the food out of the pantry and into the community with a series of five mobile food distributions designed to fill a need in local food deserts.

Together with Sheltering Arms Early Education and Family Center, Marietta YELLS, Junior League of Cobb/Marietta, Master Gardener Volunteers of Cobb County and Harry's Farmers Market, we were able to provide 3,960 pounds of fresh fruits, vegetables and dairy to 373 people (202 of whom were children) comprising 101 families.

The youth at Marietta YELLS put their leadership training skills to good use and were invaluable in helping to identify and recruit dozens of local families in their community who were in need of the extra nutritional boost. Depending on the particular date, all families received some combination of the following items during each

distribution: milk, eggs, cheese, yogurt, oranges, apples, corn, onions, potatoes, bananas, strawberries, tomatoes, squash and lettuce.

We had 16 volunteers help during the five distributions to unload the truck, weigh and count the product, and organize all food bags for each family. In addition to helping hands from our current volunteer base in the food pantry, the Junior League of Cobb/Marietta stepped up with volunteers of their own to help make this possible. Thank you to all our volunteers!

And an especially big thank you to the Cobb Community Foundation for making this program possible; their generous Cobb Community Impact grant provided \$5,000 for us to implement this pilot program. We think it was a great success and look forward to continuing to bring food out into the community in the future!

Unlike a traditional food pantry where volunteers pull groceries based on a family's size and needs, a choice pantryfeels like a regular grocery store, where families can use tokens or credits to shop for their own items according to their needs, wants and family size. In addition, we will be able to work toward furthering our mobile pantry distributions thanks to the added repair and maintenance on our 14-foot box truck and 24-foot refrigerated truck, which we frequently use to carry and deliver donated food items.
